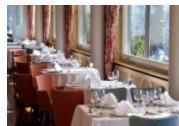

the future, where the lighting constantly changes. I learned EVERYTHING in Jeremiah's class. I continue to use his lessons on diffusing."

Artistic Masterpieces Abound at Crystal Lake



In the ***Ceramics*** class at **Crystal Lake Middle Community School**, you'll receive hands-on instruction and learn to transform raw clay into your own work of art. Beginning with the very basics, we teach construction techniques like pinch, coil and slab. In addition, we will cover hand-building techniques like rolling, paddling, molding, pulling, and shaping squeezing through a press, impressing and carving your pieces. We also teach you how to fasten additional pieces like handles, knobs and lids. Also covered are firing technique, temperature ranges for different cones of clay, and the pros and cons of digital firing vs. cone firing. This course includes an in-depth comparison of glazes and the glazing techniques, both new and old. The focus is on each student realizing his/her own creative possibilities and exploring new and different ideas.

In the ***PMC Jewelry*** class, students are meticulously creating handcrafted pieces of 99.9% pure silver jewelry out of precious metal clay. Students learn how easy it is to roll out the clay, cut in shapes and apply texture to their own one-of-a-kind pendant or opulent pair of earrings. For an even more spectacular effect, students are adding the beauty of dichroic glass to their pieces. All the fundamental aspects of ***PMC Jewelry*** design are addressed and students learn the necessary firing schedules and differences in using PMC with glass.

Students in the ***Stained Glass*** class at Crystal Lake impress family, friends, and themselves with a stained glass panel they're creating. This hands-on class is designed for fun!! Students learn how to cut glass, lay it out in creative patterns, and then solder together to create an 8" panel. An assortment of beautiful stained glass, iridized glass, textured glass, patterned glass, bevels and stringers are available to select from. Students learn glass cutting and fitting, soldering pieces together, patina and shine. This is a great beginning class where students have a beautiful hand-made stained glass panel to display at home or work. **Most Community Schools offer a wide-array of Arts & Crafts classes.**

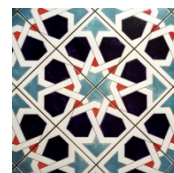
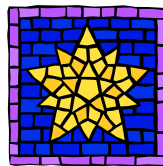
A "Nose for Flowers"
